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## READING STATIONS

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1. Choose a picture book and read it to a sibling. Discuss favorite pages, then draw your own illustration.
2. Read a chapter from a novel silently on the recliner. Talk with mom about what you think will happen next.
3. Cut out and read a newspaper article and its title. Paste them on a sheet of paper and write a short summary underneath.
4. Find an article about something interesting, then create a lap book sharing information and diagrams.



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## ARTISTIC STATIONS

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1. Paint a watercolor picture of a person, place or thing.
2. Make and decorate a note of appreciation for someone in your life. Mail it to them.
3. Practice drawing, coloring and penmanship with the Draw - Write - Now books.
4. Illustrate in the style of Eric Carle with tissue paper and craft paper cutouts.
5. Make a paper pizza by coloring and cutting out toppings, then glueing them to a paper plate.
6. Make a yarn & Fruit Loop necklace or bracelet. Eat it!



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## FREE PLAY STATIONS

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1. Build with Legos, blocks or Lincoln Logs. Break them all apart for cleanup.
2. Drive toy cars on the road mat or on a dirt track outside.
3. Play “house” with dolls or stuffed animals.
4. Make a fort with blankets on the bunk beds or with chairs.
5. Play tag, hide-and-seek, Red Rover or have a foot race.
6. Ride bikes, play catch, throw the frisbee.
7. Alternate laps in the yard or living room: high knees, bear crawl, skipping, cherry-picker, crab walk & walking backwards.
